**III. “STEP UP” AND “SERVE TOGETHER” PROGRAM INITIATIVES- DEANNA WITZEL**

The Step-Up program is a group of community leaders coming together every other month to address negative comments about the community. The goal was to come up with ideas to make the community a better place. The Step-Up program initially launched in August 2017 using the leadership skills and information gleaned from the Global Leadership Summit, at that time 86 volunteers signed up. At the first meeting the group was charged with identifying 3 positives and 3 opportunities. The 3 positives were Danville Area Community College, parks and people. The three opportunities identified were parenting and families, mental health and substance abuse. As a result, the Community Health Network was created which brings all of the community resources together in one network. It has created parenting and financial health classes as well as partnering with mentorship programs such as Big Brothers Big Sisters, Kids Hope USA and the Hope Center. The mental health group has had several mental health training classes headed up by Jim Russell which has been very successful. They are also working on addressing the stigma of mental health. The substance abuse group identified that people need help getting to rehab when a spot opens up. They addressed this by getting a car and volunteers. Rosecrance, OSF, and New Directions can now provide transportation to those in need. Law Enforcement now has a resource card to share with people they come in contact with. The mental health group also had guest speaker Tim Ryan a recovered drug addict, share his powerful message at every high school in Vermilion County. Currently OSF is looking into the possibility of opening a detox center locally. The substance abuse group is also looking into possibly opening local recovery homes as another way to support people once they have detoxed.

“Serve Together Vermilion County” is a new initiative that will be presented at the next Step Up meeting. The goal is to have local people come together and serve the immediate needs of the community and residents. Some of the actions that are planned are painting, planting flowers, and making repairs for individuals this will be June 8<sup>th</sup>. Volunteers are needed and information has been provided to the County Board Members with all the details.

Ms. Witzel also shared details regarding the next Global Leadership Summit, this is the 4<sup>th</sup> year and it will be held at the Second Church of Christ August 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>. She has a limited number of complimentary tickets available if anyone is interested.

AN ORDINANCE GOVERNING THE STORAGE, COLLECTION,  
TRANSPORTATION, AND DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTES AND OTHER REFUSE

SECTION I - PURPOSE

- 1.1 This ordinance shall govern the storage, collection, transportation and disposal of solid wastes and other refuse within the legal geographical limits of Vermilion County as provided by law. The purpose of this ordinance is to eliminate vectors and nuisances and prevent the transmission of disease organisms resulting from the improper and inadequate handling of solid waste and other refuse by regulating the storage, collection, transportation and disposal of solid waste.

SECTION II -DEFINITIONS

- 2.1 For the purpose of this ordinance, the following definitions shall apply:
- 2.1A Antique vehicle shall mean a motor vehicle that is more than 25 years of age or a bonafide replica thereof.
- 2.1B Collecting agent shall mean the person, firm or corporation engaged in the business of collecting and/or transporting solid waste and other refuse for a fee.
- 2.1.C Commercial premises shall mean all ~~grocery stores~~ retail establishments, service stations, office buildings, food processing plants, industrial plants, trailer parks, motels and all other places refuse is or may be created or accumulate.
- 2.1 D Commercial vehicles shall mean vehicles owned, operated or leased by a

collecting agent for collecting and or transporting of solid waste or other refuse.

- 2.1 E Composting shall mean the biological process by which microorganisms decompose the organic fraction of waste producing a humus-like material that may be used as a soil conditioner.
- 2.1 F Derelict vehicles shall mean any inoperable, unregistered, discarded motor vehicle, regardless of title, having lost its character as a substantial property and left unattended without justification on the owner's land contrary to public policy as expressed in Chap. 95.5, Section 4-301 of the Illinois Revised Statutes.
- 2.1 G Domestic premises shall mean all premises used for dwelling purposes including single family dwellings and multiple family dwellings.
- 2.1 H Health Administrator shall mean the Administrator of the Vermilion County Health Department or his authorized representative(s).
- 2.1 I Landscape waste shall mean all accumulation of grass, shrubbery, cuttings, leaves, tree limbs and other natural material accumulated as the result of the care **and maintenance** of lawns, shrubbery, vines and trees **exterior vegetation**.
- 2.1 J Other refuse shall be interpreted to mean bottles, tin cans, broken

glass, crockery, household garbage, plastic containers, scrap metal, vehicle parts, derelict vehicles, printed matter, paper, discarded clothing, furniture and appliances, ashes, debris from fire damage, materials resulting from the construction, remodeling, repair or demolition of structures such as wood, wall coverings, plaster, drywall, plumbing fixtures, roofing shingles and other roof coverings, electrical wiring, and any other material which has been discarded, abandoned or otherwise disposed of improperly. This does not include earth, sand, brick, stone, plaster or other substances that may accumulate during the construction of a building.

- 2.1 K Person shall mean any individual, group of individuals, association trust, partnership, corporation, person doing business under an assumed name, or other entity.
- 2.1 L Property owner shall mean the person in whose name legal title to the real estate is recorded.
- 2.1 M Recycling shall mean any process by which materials that would otherwise become solid waste or other refuse including but not limited to metals, glass, paper, leaves and plastic, are collected, separated or processed and returned to the economic mainstream in the form of raw materials or products.
- 2.1 N Resident shall mean any person or persons who may be either the property owner or a tenant living in a domestic premise.
- 2.1 O Solid waste shall mean garbage and all wastes resulting from the handling, preparation, processing or cooking of food including vegetables and

animal offal, carcasses of small dead animals, except sewage, and other water carried waste.

### SECTION III-DOMESTIC PREMISES; CONTAINERS AND ACCUMULATION OF SOLID WASTE AND REFUSE

- 3.1 It shall be the responsibility of each resident and/or property owner to provide an adequate number of approved containers to hold all solid waste and other refuse for a period of up to 14 days.
- 3.2 Containers for domestic premises shall be water tight and provided with a tight-fitting lid. Containers shall have a capacity of not less than ten nor more than 55 gallons. An approved commercial portable container service may be used.
- 3.3 It shall be unlawful for solid waste and other refuse to accumulate on any premises for a period of longer than 14 days.
- 3.4 Material accumulated on any premises for the sole purpose of recycling shall not be mixed with solid waste or other refuse and shall be stored in a manner that does not pose a threat to public health.
- 3.5 Landscape waste accumulated on any premises for the sole purpose of composting shall not be mixed with solid waste or other refuse. Composting shall be done in a manner that does not pose a treat to public health.
- 3.6 Derelict vehicles, when they pose a threat to public health, shall not be allowed to remain on private property or commercial premises for a period of longer than 30 days. Antique automobiles shall be excluded and

salvage yards holding valid licenses from the Secretary of State's office shall be excluded.

- 3.7 It shall be the responsibility of each resident and/or property owner to either employ an approved collecting agent to remove solid waste and other refuse or remove it from the premises ~~him~~ **them self** and deposit it in an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency approved and licensed disposal site.

#### SECTION IV-COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENTS: CONTAINERS AND ACCUMULATIONS OF SOLID WASTE AND REFUSE

- 4.1 It shall be the responsibility of the owner or occupant of every commercial establishment to provide an adequate number of approved containers to hold all solid waste and other refuse between collections.
- 4.2 Approved containers shall be the same for domestic premises **(Section 3.2)**.
- 4.3 It shall be unlawful for the owner or occupant of any commercial establishment to allow solid waste and other refuse to accumulate on the premises for more than 7 days.

#### SECTION V- CLEANING OF CONTAINERS

- 5.1 It shall be the responsibility of the owner of any solid waste or other refuse container to clean and maintain it in a sanitary condition.

#### SECTION VI-VEHICLES TO BE USED FOR COLLECTION AND TRANSPORTATION OF SOLID WASTE AND OTHER REFUSE

- 6.1 General - The collection and transportation of solid waste and other refuse



shall be carried out in a sanitary manner which does not endanger the public health or create a public nuisance.

- 6.2 All commercial vehicles except those vehicles owned or leased by a municipality and operated by municipal employees that transport solid waste shall be licensed. An annual fee shall be established by the Vermilion County Board. The license fee for commercial vehicles that transport solid waste shall be effective January 1 through December 31 of each calendar year.
- 6.3 Vehicle Identification - The name under which the business is conducted, and the address shall be painted with legible letters at least 3 inches high on the side of each vehicle.
- 6.4 Vehicle Construction - the collection of solid waste by commercial agents shall be in commercial vehicles with leakproof bodies and preferably completely covered with metal. If a commercial vehicle is designed with a loading hopper, the loading hopper shall be of such size that a fifty-five (55) gallon drum can be upended therein and shall be so designed as to prevent leaking during loading operations.
- 6.5 Upon receipt of a complaint regarding a vehicle used in transporting or collecting solid waste or other refuse, such vehicle shall be made available, at a reasonable time, for inspection by a representative of the Vermilion County Health Department.

6.6 The Vermilion County Health Department reserves the right to revoke an existing license or to refuse the renewal of any commercial vehicle's license belonging to a company that has an ongoing violation of any part of this ordinance.

## SECTION VII-PERFORMANCE STANDARDS FOR SOLID WASTE AND REFUSE COLLECTORS

- 7.1 All equipment used for the commercial collection of solid waste and other refuse must be designed for the sanitary and healthful transportation of such refuse and garbage.
- 7.2 Equipment shall be maintained so that it is operating properly and safely so that no solid waste or other refuse can blow or fall off the vehicle.
- 7.3 It shall be the responsibility of the owner or operator of any vehicle carrying solid waste or other refuse to retrieve any solid waste or other refuse that falls or blows off his vehicle.
- 7.4 Overnight parking of loaded solid waste and other refuse collection vehicles on public or private property so as to create an unsanitary condition or a public nuisance is prohibited.

## SECTION VII-DEAD ANIMALS

- 8.1 No person shall place or deposit or permit to be placed or deposited the carcass of a dead animal in any street, alley, road, open excavation abandoned well or cistern, ditch, stream or body of water or onto the surface of the ground or in any other manner deemed improper by the

“Illinois Dead Animal Disposal Act,” Chapter 225, Section 610 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes [225 ILCS 610].

- 8.2 The owner of the animal, when ownership can be determined, or the owner or occupant of the land on which the carcass of a dead animal is found shall promptly provide for its proper removal and disposal. The proper removal and disposal of the dead animal shall be consistent with the “Illinois Dead Animal Disposal Act,” Chapter 225, Section 610 of the Illinois Compiled Statutes [225 ILCS 610].

#### SECTION IX -PROPER DISPOSAL OF SOLID WASTE AND OTHER REFUSE

- 9.1 It shall be unlawful for any person, in person or by his agent or employee to discharge or deposit or allow to accumulate in any place within the boundaries of Vermilion County, Illinois any solid wastes or refuse except in those places and in a manner approved by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency. Substances accumulated during the building or demolition of any building or structure or part thereof shall be disposed of in a place and manner consistent with the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency rules and regulations.

#### SECTION X -SOLID WASTE AND OTHER REFUSE CREATED BY FIRE DAMAGE, NEGLIGENCE AND/OR DETERIORATION OF STRUCTURES.

- 10.1 It shall be the responsibility of the property owner to remove all solid waste and other refuse created by fire damage.
- 10.2 Any structure including but not limited to houses, apartments, barns, trailers, and mobile homes determined to be damaged to the extent it may

become a health hazard, shall be demolished and removed by the property owner within 30 days after the completion of any investigation by police, fire officials, insurance companies, state's attorney or state fire marshal.

- 10.3 It shall be the responsibility of the property owner to appropriately demolish and remove buildings that have been rendered uninhabitable by neglect or deterioration

#### SECTION XI-ENFORCEMENT

- 11.1 This rule and ordinance shall be enforced by the Administrator and his authorized representatives.
- 11.2 No person shall violate any provision of this ordinance or abatement orders made in pursuance thereof, obstruct or interfere with the execution of an abatement order, or willfully neglect to obey an abatement order.

#### SECTION X11-PENALTIES

- 12.1 A violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance, excluding Section 8 where penalties are otherwise provided by law, is a petty offense punishable by a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$500.00 for each offense as provided by law. Each day the violation continues shall constitute a separate offense. Offenders may also be ordered to abate the violation by demolishing uninhabitable buildings and by removing building remains, solid waste and other refuse to a state-licensed landfill or scrapyard.

#### SECTION XIII-UNCONSTITUTIONALITY OF CLAUSE

- 13.1 Should an section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance

be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reasons, the remainder of said ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

#### SECTION XIV-DATE OF EFFECT

- 14.1 These rules and ordinances shall be in full force throughout the County of Vermilion, Illinois from and after their passage and approval by the Vermilion County Board as provided by law; and, at that time, all Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

**AN ORDINANCE GOVERNING POTABLE WATER WELLS AND WATER  
SUPPLIES IN VERMILION COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

**SECTION I:           PURPOSE**

1.1 This ordinance is established to eliminate disease transmission and chemical poisons through provision of a safe, potable, adequate supply of water for drinking, culinary and sanitary purposes for every individual within Vermilion County, Illinois.

**SECTION II:          DEFINITIONS**

- 2.1 Cistern means a source of water supply developed by intercepting rainfall with roof surfaces.
- 2.2 Community Water System means a public water system which serves at least 15 service connections used by residents or regularly serves at least 25 residents at least 60 days a year.
- 2.3 County Health Department means the Vermilion County Health Department.
- 2.4 Health Administrator shall mean the Administrator of the Vermilion County Health Department or his authorized representative(s).
- 2.5 Non-Community Water System means a public water system that is not a community water system, that has at least 15 service connections used by non-residents, or regularly serves 25 or more non-resident individuals daily for at least 60 days a year.
- 2.6 Private Water Supply means any supply which provides water for drinking, culinary and sanitary purposes and serves an owner-occupied single-family dwelling.
- 2.7 Public Water System means a system for the provision to the public of piped water for human consumption, if the system has at least 15 service connections or regularly serves an average of at least 25 individuals daily at least 60 days per year. The term Public Water System includes any collection, treatment, storage and distribution facilities under control of the operator of such system and used primarily in connection with such system and any collection or pretreatment

storage facilities not under such control which are used primarily in connection with such system.

2.8 Semi-Private Water System means a water supply which is not a public water system, yet which serves a segment of the public other than an owner-occupied single-family dwelling.

2.9 Water Well means any excavation that is drilled, cored, bored, washed, driven, dug, jetted or otherwise constructed when the intended use of such excavation is for the location, diversion, artificial recharge or acquisition of ground water, but such term does not include an excavation made for the purpose of obtaining or prospecting for oil, natural gas, minerals or products of mining or quarrying or for inserting media to repressure oil or natural gas bearing formation or for storing petroleum, natural gas or other products or for observation or any other purpose in connection with the development of operation of a gas storage project.

### **SECTION III: PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY USE**

3.1 In those locations where a public water supply is reasonably available, that supply should be the sole source of water for drinking and culinary purposes.

### **SECTION IV: WATER SUPPLY LOCATION, CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR**

4.1 **Water Wells.** Except as otherwise herein provided, the location, construction, repair and disinfection of water wells, and the installation of water well pumps, shall be in accordance with the requirements set forth by the Illinois Department of Public Health Illinois Water Well Construction Code (77 Ill. Adm. Code 920) and Illinois Water Well Pump Installation Code (77 Ill. Adm. Code 925), which are hereby made part of this ordinance by reference.

Copies of said Regulations shall be available at the County Health Department office.

Wells that are abandoned shall be sealed in a manner prescribed by the Illinois Water Well Construction Code.

4.2 **Surface Water Supplies.** All non-community and semi-private water systems which receive



their source of water from ponds, lakes, streams, rivers or other surface collectors of water shall be designed, constructed, and operated in accordance with the Illinois Department of Public Health Surface Source Water Treatment Code (77 Ill. Adm. Code 930).

- 4.3 Cistern. Cisterns shall not be used for a water supply except where adequate ground water resources are not available. Non-community and semi-private water systems that use cistern water and surface water supplies shall receive treatment in accordance with the Illinois Department of Public Health Surface Source Water Treatment Code (77 Ill. Adm. Code 930).

**SECTION V: DISINFECTION AND ANALYSIS**

- 5.1 Owners of newly constructed wells or other types of water supplies which supply a semi-private water system shall have the water from their semi-private water supply analyzed and approved by either the laboratory by the Illinois Department of Public Health or a laboratory approved by the Illinois Department of Public Health before the well or other water supply is placed into service. A copy of the analysis shall be filed with the County Health Department. The water obtained from a surface supply shall meet the nitrate, turbidity, and bacteriological requirements contained in Sections 900.50, 900.60 and 900.70 of the Illinois Department of Public Health Drinking Water Systems Code (77 Ill. Adm. Code 900), and the water obtained from a well shall meet the nitrate and bacteriological requirements of Section 900.50 and 900.70 of the Drinking Water Systems Code.
- 5.2 The well-sampling fee associated with home-loan inspections shall be \$75.00 for the initial sampling, and \$35.00 for each additional resampling.
- 5.3 The fee for processing water samples for out-of-state residents will be \$35.00.

**SECTION VI: WATER LINES**

- 6.1 Except as otherwise herein provided, the location, construction, and material standards of all

water lines of the distribution system shall be in accordance with the requirements set forth by the Illinois Department of Public Health's Plumbing Code (77 Ill. Adm. Code Chapter I 890).

**SECTION VII: PERMIT REQUIRED**

~~7.1 A permit to construct or deepen a water well such as a private water well, semi-private water well, non-community water well and non-potable water wells: such as, but not limited to, wells used solely for irrigation purposes or livestock watering must be obtained from the County Health Department.~~

7.1 The County Health Department shall issue a permit for Water Well and Closed Loop Well Systems;

a. A permit to construct, deepen, modify or seal a water well such as a private water well, semi-private water well, non-community water well and non-potable water wells such as, but not limited to, wells used solely for irrigation purposes or livestock watering must be obtained from the County Health Department.

b. A permit to construct, modify or seal a closed loop well system must be obtained from the County Health Department.

7.2 All wells and pumps shall be maintained in a safe condition by the owner.

7.3 A non-community public water supply shall not be operated without first obtaining a permit from the Illinois Department of Public Health.

7.4 The requirement for permit in this ordinance shall not be applicable to wells intended to serve a community public water supply system, ~~geothermal closed-loop wells~~, and monitoring wells.

**SECTION VII: APPLICATION FOR PERMIT**

8.1 Applications for permits shall be in writing and in such form that shall be prescribed by the County Health Department.

~~8.2 A permit application fee of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) shall be paid to the~~

~~County Health Department before a permit is issued.~~

8.2 A permit application fee shall be paid to the County Health Department before a permit is issued.

a. A permit application fee of one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) shall be paid to the County Health Department before a permit is issued.

1) No fee shall be charged for an issuance of a permit to seal a water well.

b. A permit fee shall be paid to the Health Department based on (415 ILCS/) Illinois Water Well Construction Code Section 920.200 d) Closed Loop Well System Permit Fee. The fee to be paid for a permit to construct, modify or abandon a closed loop well shall be the amount specified in the code unless stated otherwise in this section of the ordinance.

8.3 A permit shall be valid for a period of 12 months, thereafter a new permit must be obtained.

#### **SECTION IX: REQUIRED INSPECTIONS**

9.1 The County Health Department shall be notified by telephone or in writing at least 48 hours prior to the commencement of any work to construct or deepen a well for which a permit has been issued, or to seal a water well, boring, or monitoring well. The County Health

Department shall be allowed access to any property for the purpose of performing inspection of water well construction or to inspect the sealing of wells or to investigate abandoned wells.

**SECTION X: LICENSING OF WELL DRILLERS AND PUMP INSTALLERS**

10.1 All individuals who construct water wells and install well pumps shall be licensed by the Illinois Department of Public Health in accordance with the Water Well and Pump Installation Contractor's License Act Chapter III Paragraph 7101 et seq. latest edition.

**SECTION XI: ENFORCEMENT**

11.1 This rule and ordinance shall be enforced by the Administrator and his authorized representatives.

11.2 No person shall violate any provision of this ordinance or order made in pursuance thereof, obstruct or interfere with the execution of an order, or willfully neglect to obey an order.

**SECTION XII: PENALTIES**

12.1 A violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance, excluding sections where penalties are otherwise provided by law, is a petty offense punishable by a fine not less than \$25.00 or more than \$500.00 for each offense, as provided by law. Each day the violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.

**SECTION XIII: EFFECTIVE DATE**

13.1 This ordinance shall be effective on and after the 12th day of September, 1989.
