MYTH: If I get an STD, including HIV, there is nothing I can do about it.

FACT: Many STDs are curable and most, including HIV, are treatable.

- There are different treatments for different STDs.
- **MYTH:** The Pill prevents STDs.
 - FACT: The Pill does not prevent STDs.
 - The Pill prevents pregnancy.

MYTH: Teens don't get STDs.

- **FACT:** About three million teenagers get an STD every year.
 - STDs are mostly found in persons between the ages of 15 and 24.

MYTH: You can't get STDs from skin-to-skin contact.

FACT: You can get some STDs through skin-to-skin contact. You may be at risk if you have cuts or tears on your body.

MYTH: You won't get an STD if you urinate, wash, or douche after sex.

FACT: If exposed to an STD, see a doctor for treatment options.

• Douching after sex is not recommended because it can destroy healthy bacteria that help fight infection.

MYTH: You can tell if your partner has an STD.

FACT: Some STDs do not have any symptoms that you can see.

- The only way to know for sure if you have an STD is to get tested.
- You can get an STD from having sex with someone who has no symptoms.

FACT: STDs can be spread through vaginal, oral, or anal sex with an infected person.

• Anyone who is sexually active can get an STD.

MYTH: Having sex in a hot tub or pool will protect you from STDs because chlorine kills germs.FACT: STDs can be spread through intercourse even in the presence of chlorine.

• There's no replacement for a condom when it comes to protecting yourself against STDs.

MYTH: Only people that have a lot of sex partners are at risk of getting STDs.

FACT: It only takes one person, one time, to get an STD.

• When you have unprotected sex with someone, you are exposed to all of their previous sex partners.

MYTH: Once you have had an STD you can't get it again.

FACT: You can get an STD again even if you have been treated for that STD before.
