Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STDs)

MYTH: You can't get STDs from skin-to-skin contact.

FACT: You can get some STDs through skin-to-skin contact. You may be at risk if you have cuts or tears on your body.

MYTH: You won't get STDs if you only have oral or anal sex.

FACT: STDs can be spread through vaginal, oral, or anal sex with an infected person.

- Anyone who is sexually active can get an STD.

MYTH: The Pill prevents STDs.

FACT: The Pill does not prevent STDs.

- The Pill prevents pregnancy.

MYTH: Teens don't get STDs.

FACT: About three million teenagers get an STD every year.

- STDs are mostly found in persons between the ages of 15 and 24.

MYTH: Once you have had an STD you can't get it again.

FACT: You can get an STD again even if you have been treated for that STD before.
